



# BURGEE COLLECTION

Originally collected for Capt. Daley's *SV PRINCIPESSA*, these burgees are unfortunately not now on a boat. Captain Daley sold the *SV PRINCIPESSA* in 2007. There are another couple of dozens of burgees that need to be added to the list from burgee swaps in the United Kingdom.



I would be remiss to not fly this burgee at the top of all others. After all, this is where I learned to sail - Fall of 1969, the River Charles, Cambridge, Mass at the MIT Sailing Pavilion. This is the burgee of the MIT Sailing Team. I was given this burgee in 1998 for introducing the Sailing Pavilion to Stu Fried at Prestige Flag Co. They currently make the best value for money burgees on the market.




Rush Creek Yacht Club is located on the east side of Lake Ray Hubbard on the east side of Dallas, TX. This was the first yacht club I joined. I received my burgee in August of 1983.




St. Thomas Yacht Club is located on the East side of St. Thomas, US Virgin Islands. The members were very gracious and hospitable to us when we anchored our charter boat there. We did a burgee swap in August of 1984.




Rated by Conde Nast Traveler as one of the top tropical resorts in the world, the Bitter End has been a mecca for sailors for nearly 30 years. It is a friendly, lively, casually elegant family-operated and eco-conscious resort located on one of the most unspoiled, spectacular and sheltered deepwater harbors in the Caribbean. It is accessible only by boat, and features 100 island-style rooms in Beachfront and Hillside Villas and Commodore Club Suites, all with spectacular views. I purchased their burgee in August of 1984.



Cedar Mills Yacht Club is located on the western side of Lake Texoma, an inland lake on the Texas - Oklahoma border. I joined the club in 1994 and enjoy cruising and racing with other club members. The marina is the home of the Valiant Yacht Fabrication Plant. I received my burgee in May of 1994.




Texoma Sailing Club is located on the eastern side of Lake Texoma, an inland lake on the Texas - Oklahoma border. I joined the club in 1995 and enjoy cruising and racing with other club members. The club is known for hosting Lakefest, one of the 10 best regattas in the US which raises over \$100,000 for children's charities. I received my burgee in May of 1995.



Fort Worth Boat Club was the host of the 1996 J22 World Championships (for which they won the 1997 St. Petersburg Trophy for excellence in race management), the 1996 Catalina 22 National Championship and the 1997 Foster's Lager JY15 North American Championship. We did a burgee swap in June of 1996.

Wichita Falls Yacht Club. We did a burgee swap in November of 1996.



The St. Francis Yacht Club was founded in 1927 on a site already rich in local lore. Earlier, while this was still marshland, it was also home to the Stone Boat Yard and the building of a schooner named Yankee. The 1906 earthquake knocked the Yankee off its keel, but the boat was picked up and finished. Today, after multiple terms as a St. Francis flagship, it can still be seen, its bow aimed toward the Marina Green. The yacht harbor was begun as part of the Panama Pacific Exposition of 1915, of which only the nearby Palace of Fine Arts remains. The Club itself opened just barely ahead of the Depression. St. Francis yachts stood patrol duty during World War II, and later they carried the burgee around the world. We did a burgee swap in January of 1997.




Sausalito Yacht Club is located in Sausalito, California just across the Golden Gate Bridge from San Francisco. It is a quaint club with quick access to the bay. We did a burgee swap in January of 1997.



Founded in 1869, the San Francisco Yacht Club is the oldest club on the Pacific Coast of North America. The original anchorage and clubhouse were located in San Francisco near Mission Rock in San Francisco, but inadequate depth of water and increasing industrial growth in the area resulted in a move to Sausalito. Waterfront property was purchased and a new clubhouse erected, but it was subsequently destroyed by fire in 1897. The rebuilt building is still standing and now houses a restaurant. Increasing ferry traffic and congestion contributed to a decision to move again in 1926. We did a burgee swap in January of 1997.



The Corinthian Yacht Club, Tiburon, California. The Corinthian's primary concern has always been yachting. Originally founded to unite small boat owners, the Corinthian now accommodates all types of yachts. Always at the fore front of sailing tradition in the Bay Area, the Corinthian founded such popular traditions as Opening Day on the Bay, The Blessing of the Fleet, and the Midwinter races. The Corinthian encourages the sailors of the future by offering affordable memberships to younger enthusiasts. And year-round sailing instruction is available to ocean-goers of all ages. We did a burgee swap in January of 1997.



The objective of the NASS (Naval Academy Sailing Squadron) is to provide service in support of the mission of the United States Naval Academy by assisting in sail training of midshipman. To promote high standards of skill and sportsmanship. To encourage development of sailing, piloting, navigation, boat handling, safety and racing skills as a contribution to midshipman training. We did a burgee swap in June of 1997.



The Annapolis Yacht Club is located on the shores of the Chesapeake Bay in downtown Annapolis. We did a burgee swap in June of 1997.



The Nantucket Yacht Club is located in the harbor of Nantucket, Mass. We did a burgee swap in July of 1997.



The Edgartown Yacht Club is located on the east side of Martha's Vineyard, Mass. We did a burgee swap in July of 1997.


The Wood's Hole Yacht Club is located in the harbor of Wood's Hole, Mass. We did a burgee swap in July of 1997.



The Royal Canadian Yacht Club, located in Toronto, Canada, has two club houses. The summer club house is located on one of the Toronto Islands and the boats are slipped there. The winter club house is located downtown and houses a heated swimming pool, badminton and squash courts, 3 dining rooms, workout facilities. It is very elegant. I purchased a burgee in December of 1997 from the RCYC.



The National Yacht Club located in Toronto, Canada is located on the western entrance to Toronto Harbor. It is across the harbor entrance from a city airport and the planes fly amazingly close to the club house on takeoff. It is the home of some of the friendliest sailors I've met. We did a burgee swap in November of 1997.



Port Credit Yacht Club is located in Toronto, Canada near the water cooling discharge of a coal fired electric power plant. The water temperature stays in the 40's while the air temperature is freezing in the winter time. The boats do not have to be pulled and it is the home of many live-aboard sailors in Toronto. We did a burgee swap in December of 1997.



San Diego Yacht Club is by far one of the most beautiful clubs in an ideal location for both racing and cruising. The cleanliness of the facilities and docks were most impressive. Dennis Connors' Stars and Stripes was slipped there though later I saw her on the hard near the Convention Center with keel wrapped in preparation for the America's Cup 1999-2000 challenge. The staff and members were very friendly and hospitable. I look forward to returning soon! We did a burgee swap in May of 1998.



Founded in 1885, Sandy Bay Yacht Club is located at the end of the T-Dock in in the scenic and historic coastal town of Rockport, Massachusetts. We did a burgee swap in September of 1998.



The Eastern Yacht Club is on the neck section of Marblehead. We did a burgee swap in September, 1998.



The Boston Yacht Club, nestled in the historic "Old Town" section of Marblehead, is the third oldest yacht club in the country, and the oldest club in New England. From its founding days in 1866 through the present, the club's history has been rich in lore. The membership roll holds names such as Nathaniel Herreshoff, General Benjamin Butler, Sir Thomas Lipton, Franklin Delano Roosevelt, and Ted Hood. We did a burgee swap in September, 1998.



The Waikiki Yacht Club is strategically located on the entrance to Waikiki Beach. Harry Sprangler, the club's Flag Chairman, greeted us warmly and showed us the club's collection of 1,066 burgees. He arranged for us to participate in a spinnaker class race to Pearl Harbor and back at sunset which lit up the entire Waikiki skyline in gold. We did a burgee swap in October of 1998.



We had dinner here the first night in Hawaii. It appeared that a lot of liveaboards were stationed here, many I suppose having sailed into Hawaii. October, 1998.



We explored around the Mission Bay area of San Diego and found this delightful small club. They were having a raft up at the club house. Two long lines of boats, one line for powerboats and one line for sailboats.
